Conservation Visions/Shane Mahoney has just released a new film vignette - Eating Eden to Extinction - which discusses the African bushmeat crisis, the most immediate threat to the future of wildlife in Africa (even more detrimental to wildlife conservation than habitat loss, according to USFWS). This film is highly relevant to the Wild Harvest Initiative[®]. As we move forward with the WHI Program, we will engage more fully with the international sustainable use community, drawing comparisons between the African bushmeat crisis (and similar conditions in other tropical and sub-tropical regions) and the North American historical circumstance, which resulted in the development of the North American Model and the recovery, and sustained existence, of wildlife on the continent. We believe modern wild meat harvests in temperate regions, such as North America, should be studied alongside other regions, and that they are likely to provide valuable insights and help guide solutions to address unsustainable harvests in other parts of the world. Broader international engagement will increase the Wild Harvest Initiative's® impact and reach, while showcasing the North American Model as a "best practice example" and garnering significant additional support for sustainable wildlife use, globally, and in North America.



•Essay Contest Sponsored By: Outdoors Tomorrow Foundation





- •Eligibility: Students ages 11-17 currently enrolled in any OTF's Outdoor Adventures school are eligible for participation. Winners of the 2018 contest are not eligible. Applicants must have a Hunter Education certification from their state <u>before attending a camp</u>.
- •Deadline for Entry: Friday, February 22, 2019.
- •Number of Entries per school: There is no limit to the number of entries per school.
- •Specifications: Essay or short story should be double-spaced on white, $8\ 1/2\ x\ 11$ paper, with $1\ 1/2$ inch margins on top, bottom and sides. Typewritten copy is preferred. All essays or short stories must be legible.
- •Length should not exceed 1,000 words (four typewritten pages) for short stories, or 500 words (two typewritten pages) for essays.
- •Papers should be carefully proofed for spelling, punctuation, capitalization and grammar.
- •A completed entry form must be used as a cover sheet and stapled to the essay or short story. Entry must be signed by the Outdoor Adventures teacher. Entry form is on next page. All entries will be accessible for publication to support the Outdoors Tomorrow Foundation mission to teach outdoor education and to promote and fund wildlife conservation worldwide.
- •Judging: All essays or short stories will be judged in one of two categories: 11-14 age group or 15-17 age group. Applicants will be judged on the use of the theme concept, creativity, neatness, proper grammar and punctuation. Winners of the statewide competition will be notified by phone.
- •Prizes: In the 11-14 age category: One boy and one girl will receive a scholarship to the Outdoor Texas Camp for hunting during the summer of 2019. Outdoor Texas Camp's hunting camp is a unique, hands-on camp designed for girls and boys aged 9-16. The program covers hunting techniques, shotgun skills, survival, GPS use, tracking and interpreting sign, small and large caliber rifle skills and scoring and aging deer.
- •In the 15-17 age category: One student will receive a scholarship to attend the Texas Bobwhite Brigade camp during the summer of 2019.
- •Texas Bobwhite Brigade is a wildlife and natural resource-focused leadership development program for youth. Youth are introduced to habitat management, honing their communication skills, and development of a land ethic. The state's leading wildlife biologists and land managers serve as instructors and mentors. Mission is to educate and empower youth with leadership skills and knowledge in wildlife and stewardship to become conservation ambassadors for a sustained natural resource legacy across Texas




