# 2014 DEF's Outdoor Adventures Educator of the Year – Jason Anderson

### 590 Student Enrolled in Outdoor Adventures at Allen High School



The Dallas Ecological Foundation's 2014 Outdoor Adventures Educator of the Year is Jason Anderson, Allen High School's Lowery Freshman Center. Mr. Anderson has an incredible Outdoor Adventures program where he teaches the course full-time. In fact, there is such a high interest in Outdoor Adventures education at Lowery additional teachers are required to teach the enrollment. Mr. Anderson is one of three teachers and the school administration is looking at adding a fourth teacher next year. The extra Outdoor Adventure teachers allow Mr. Anderson to offer an Outdoor Adventures II class. In this class, the students are able to expand and research wildlife conservation, outdoor skill activities and shooting sports at a greater depth than the regular course. He also organizes a field trips, organize an Archery Club, Bass Fishing Club

and the Allen Competitive Shooting Team. Allen I.S.D. administration is very supportive of the program. In fact, the school district completely remodeled the school's old Agriculture Building to make it the new Outdoor Adventures Building. There is a full indoor archery range, two classrooms, offices and rest rooms devoted to the Outdoor Adventures program. The school principal, Ms. Jill Stafford, loves the enthusiasm and hands-on experienced Outdoor Adventures provides the students. It is one of the most popular courses in the entire school district. Students love the class and a waiting list just to enroll has been created to meet the demand. The Physical Education department enrollment grew by 40% this past year. Outdoor Adventures grew 107% to 590 students for the 2013-14 school year. Outdoor Adventures students are enjoying numerous after school programs. The after and before school clubs in archery, fishing and shooting sports allows for hundreds of students to participate in activities that are unique to


Outdoor Adventures. The students are able to shoot archery in the indoor facility and use a laser shotgun similar to help with safety and proper shooting techniques. The students compete in tournaments across north Texas. Individuals and the Allen teams have successfully competed at the state and national level with several teams winning state honors. Not too bad for a program in its third year.

The 21<sup>st</sup> annual Wildlife Conservation Camp will be held July 20-26, 2014 at the Welder Wildlife Foundation in Sinton, Texas. High school students that have completed the 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades can apply at <a href="www.wildlifecamptx.org">www.wildlifecamptx.org</a> and applications are due May 1<sup>st</sup>.

Campers will experience hands-on activities led by wildlife professionals, which include wildlife and plant identification, hunting as a management tool, species diversity, conservation ethics, wildlife capture and survey techniques, wildlife tracking, predator-prey dynamics, white-tailed deer management, fishing, hunter safety, shooting skills, and much more. The week-long camp is especially recommended for high school students who are considering a career in wildlife management or natural sciences. Students will develop an appreciation for the outdoors through a priceless experience that they will carry with them forever.

The Welder Refuge is a 7,800-acre wildlife refuge and research facility with on-site lodging and dining facilities. The Refuge is home to beautiful coastal wetlands and south Texas vegetation, and boasts a plethora of native wildlife, including mammals, reptiles, amphibians and hundreds of species of birds. Campers will have the opportunity to view and study these animals on the Refuge.

The camp fee is \$300 which covers lodging, meals, materials, and transportation during camp. Contact your local Farm Bureau for possible sponsorships.


