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

Product Description

The Hatfield SAS 12 is a semi-automatic 12 ga. shotgun featuring a walnut buttstock and forend with deluxe checkering and a recoil absorbing 1" ventilated rubber recoil pad. The SAS operating system is a unique blend of gas and inertia, where a gas piston moves only one inch to kick the bolt rearward and start the bolts inertia travel through the operating cycle; fewer moving parts provides higher dependability. The SAS gas/inertia system operates dependably with most commercially available 2.75" and 3" shells and a special gas piston is included for use when firing the new ultra-high energy 3 magnum ammunition currently on the market. The gas/inertia action is housed inside a receiver machined from 7075 aluminum finished in a high gloss black anodizing. The SAS 28" barrel is chambered for both 2.75" and 3" shells and features a full length ventilated rib and screw-in chokes; three chokes (F, Mod and IC) are included. The barrel finish is high gloss black chrome to match the receiver. Magazine capacity is 4+1 rounds, but with a magazine plug included to limit the capacity to 2+1 rounds. Total weight is approximately 7.75 lbs.

Texas Hunter and Boater Education registration is now on-line.

Here are a few reminders to help create your Hunter and Boater Education courses on-line so you students can register:

1. After you log in **you must create a location**. Don't forget to add the location to every course you create.

2. There is a **72-hour window to make edits to your class** after the end date of the course. That means you can make changes and register students up to 72 hours after the course ends. However, you will have to email the course link to any student who wants to register immediately after the course end date. When you reach the time and date entered for the end of the class, it is no longer visible to the public. You must go to the course page and copy the link for that course then email it to the student who needs to register. If you miss the 72 hour window, the only thing you can do is schedule another class in the system for that student. Students and classes are directly tied to revenue and students cannot be added to classes after 72 hours.

3. No matter what a student tells you, if their name is not on the roster, they are not registered.

4. Everyone must use a **unique email address**, it **is required**. A parent or friend cannot register someone with their email address. The same email address may not be used twice. The email address is part of the security protocol and used to identify the user. We are working on allowing students to register for a class without an email address. The problem with that is, they will not be able to login and make changes to their profile. They will have to call TPWD when they get a valid email address in the future. We have found that there are a lot more children without email addresses than first thought and we want to accommodate them.

5. Instructors will always be required to have a unique email address.

6. When someone is logged in, student or instructor, the system's navigation remembers who you are, that is part of the basic principles of the system. Do not register for a class or help someone register for a class when you are logged in. Always log out when you are helping customers, or students register for a class.

7. We are transitioning to electronic payment only. Only teachers from School Districts with a written policy prohibiting the use of a purchase card for this payment type may submit a check. When a check is submitted the course number must be on the check and a copy of the roster must be submitted with the payment. Also remember that all instructors must provide the students with a temp card if you are not paying for the course within the 72 window or a customer is going to participate in the activity immediately. Permanent cards are not available until payment has been received by the TPWD revenue department.
